VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES AT TYLER ARBORETUM
Summer volunteers critically needed for specific positions

MEDIA, Pa (May 30, 2013) – Summer is a busy time at Tyler Arboretum, which means more volunteers than ever are needed to keep the organization running smoothly. Two volunteer positions in particular need to be filled in order to make this summer the best yet for its guests and members. Tyler Arboretum has an urgent need for Butterfly House guides and volunteer Summer Camp Assistants and *you* could be perfect for Tyler’s fun and relaxed atmosphere.

Volunteers are needed for the duration of the Butterfly House Exhibit, June 29-August 24, to greet visitors and share information about butterflies and what is happening in the House that day. Volunteers are also needed to net butterflies in the Arboretum and release them in the House. No experience is necessary, but training is required. Butterfly House volunteers commit to a flexible schedule of two-hour shifts with a minimum of two times per month. One training session is required to work in the Butterfly House. Training session will be held on Wednesday, June 5 from 1:30 – 4:00 p.m. **or** Saturday, June 8 from 10:00 a.m.-12:30 p.m.

Summer Camp Assistants are needed to work with our education team to help campers with games, hikes, crafts and projects. Positions are available in one-week increments from June 24 – August 16. These positions are perfect for teens 15 years or older who love the outdoors and enjoy working with kids. This is a fun way to fulfill school or other service requirements and interviews are required.
