Beekeeping Basics

Keeping bees provides the opportunity for great local honey while also providing an ecological service. Learn the ins and outs of beekeeping from Tyler apiarist **Paul Strommer**. Veils will be provided for all participants, allowing for a hands-on, interactive experience. *Though bee stings rarely happen, they are always a possibility. Medicinal Meanderings Series

Saturdays, June 20, July 18 and August 15,
10:00 – 11:30 am

Join **Katelyn Melvin** of Tooth of the Lion Apothecary for a series of three medicinal and edible plant walks through Tyler's gardens. Focusing on each plant's medicinal qualities, we will cover historical importance, ethnobotanical perspectives, phytochemical properties and contemporary usage. Each walk has a unique botanical focus, covering species from the lowly dandelion to the towering black cherry. Learn identification, practical wildcrafting techniques and ethics, as well as uses applicable to your home kitchen. We'll end our walks with a Q&A under the shade, while enjoying a freshly wildcrafted tea made from a plant that we discussed that day.

🌿 June 20: Beneficial Garden Weeds

Discover the medicinal and culinary properties of some of the most common garden and lawn weeds. From healing bee stings and burns to respiratory infections, these "weeds" may in fact be worthy of



our attention. Learn to utilize and work with, rather than against, these abundant plants!

🌿 July 18: Useful Meadow Plants

We know that meadows play a restorative role in our native ecosystems – now, let's investigate their medicinal potential. Discover the history and usage of commonly used plants, such as *Echinacea*, as well as many other little known yet powerful medicinal meadow plants.

🌿 August 15: Vital Trees & Woody Plants

In addition to providing food, shelter and habitat, trees also contain active compounds that have provided important medicines throughout history. Learn about our native and cultivated medicinal trees: which part to use, how and when to harvest, and how to incorporate these magnificent specimens as a supportive piece of your own health and wellness.
